## Social Justice Is at the Heart of Who We Are

A popular broadcaster, radio host and best-selling author recently claimed that any church that talked about “social justice” was simply using code words for Nazism and communism. He suggested that anyone hearing the language of social justice from their local church pulpits should ‘run as fast as you can’ away from that church.

He got it all wrong. On the contrary, if you *don't* hear your community of faith lift up the cause of justice, that community of faith has missed something at the very heart of our holy scriptures and essential to our faith.

The Hebrew prophets sound a loud refrain calling God's people to the cause and work of justice. At the center of that clarion call is a consistent concern for the poorest of God's people and for all those moved to the margins by a merciless and bruising society. The witness of Jesus underscores that same commitment to the suffering and oppressed. In his teachings and in his daily walk, Jesus regularly exemplified that the poor and ignored should not only be treated with compassion, but that our faith does at times call us further, to question the cultural norms and societal realities that leave so many behind.

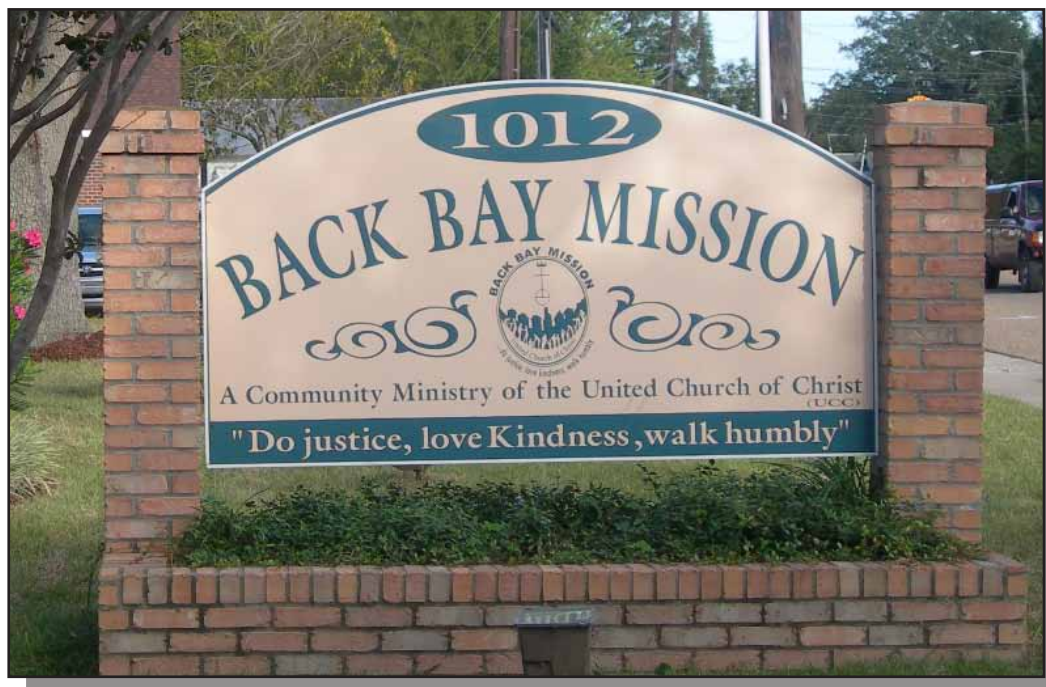
Back Bay Mission for years has drawn upon the prophetic mandate of Micah – to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with our God – as partial inspiration for our own work. While we labor daily to provide immediate assistance in the midst of deep need, we also know that charity without justice restricts our vision and limits our impact. The two must go hand in hand. Our faith demands it. The scriptures teach it. Our world requires it.

Our mission statement says it again: we “serve the Mississippi Gulf Coast and the wider church community by *faithful witness for social justice* and *compassionate service to the poor and marginalized.*” There's nothing scary and radical about that. It's just good faith.

# Micah Center Opens

On a cold afternoon last February, Coast Chamber of Commerce staff, Biloxi city officials and Back Bay Mission staff gathered for an historic occasion: the ribbon cutting and official opening of the Mission's Micah Center, one of the new buildings on campus.

The day center for the homeless "opened for business" March 8 and has welcomed guests each Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9:30-11:30 a.m. and 1:30-3:30 p.m. ever since. The center offers the homeless a place to shower, do laundry, receive mail, use a computer for job searching and take advantage of a host of other services offered by various agencies, e.g., Social

Security, Mississippi WIN Job Center (Mississippi's employment and unemployment office) that send representatives to the Micah Center on a rotating basis. It is, in essence, a "one stop" service center for people needing these services.

Although it is not a shelter, it also offers homeless guests a daytime place to seek refuge from the weather, have a cup of coffee and take advantage of networking opportunities.

# Workcamping Q & A

**M**ore than 40 years ago, Back Bay Mission began to act as a host site for individuals and congregations who sought transformational experiences of volunteer service in a setting of the Church. Today, Back Bay Mission is one of the most respected and popular “work camp” destinations in the United Church of Christ, and that shows no signs of abating.

In the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, we expanded the number of weeks when groups could be with us, increased our staff, and took on more extensive housing reconstruction projects in low-income neighborhoods. In 2009, we completed the construction of the new Mission House, a facility designed to house up to 44 volunteers per week for this important work. And yet we’re still left with the wonderful predicament of having more churches wanting to volunteer with us than the number we can accommodate.

In an effort to keep you informed, here are some answers to the most frequently asked questions about this program:

- ***How can we sign up?***

Please check our website: [www.thebackbaymission.org](http://www.thebackbaymission.org) for a list of weeks available. We update the Work Camp listings on a weekly basis and do show two years at a time. Currently, all weeks are booked for 2010 and only a few openings remain for 2011. Once you select a date, please call or email the Volunteer Coordinator ([volunteercoordinator@thebackbaymission.org](mailto:volunteercoordinator@thebackbaymission.org)) to confirm availability; a check for \$200 (registration fee) will secure your spot.

- ***Our group has been going to BBM forever! Why can't we schedule the week we've always had before?***

Because of the popularity of our work camp program, the fact that we can accept a maximum of only 40 individuals per week, and the increasingly limited amount of funding available for projects, it is very possible your favorite week will not be available for your group next year. We do maintain a “wait list” for future years which would be confirmed beginning January 1 of the year prior. For instance: if you would like to reserve space for 2012, we would add you to the wait list and officially confirm space availability in January 2011.



- ***What are the accommodations like these days?***

Our new Mission House will be your home during your stay. The building consists of two large dormitory rooms (one for men, one for women) and each dormitory room can sleep up to 22 in bunk beds. Bath facilities are directly across the hall from each dormitory room. Groups bring their own bedding (sheets or sleeping bag, and towels). Pillows are provided. The kitchen is commercially designed with large pantry, walk-in cooler, freezer, ice machine, dishwasher, 12-burner gas range, convection ovens, plus all the utensils you would find in your own home. The dining/lounge area is perfect for end of the day reflections, TV viewing and conversation. Plus the screened porch is very popular for relaxing on balmy evenings.

- ***What fees do you charge?***

Once we confirm your group for a particular week, a \$200 registration fee is payable to finalize enrollment in our program. This fee helps offset the costs associated with the Housing Recovery program. When your group arrives at Back Bay Mission, a fee of \$75 per person is payable for Mission House accommodations. Groups are responsible for all food purchases, plus incidentals such as paper towels, hand dishwashing detergent and toilet paper. In addition, we urge groups to consider raising additional funds to assist with purchase of construction materials for their work projects.

We *love* that you love our program! Please work with us in patience and understanding as we strive to offer high quality experiences in service to the Church and our community!

## Boxes vs. Beds

It could have been worse – “a dark and stormy night” – but fortunately, it wasn’t. However, it *was* very cold the night members of the Mosaic Church in Ocean Springs decided to call attention to the plight of the homeless in a not-so-pleasant way. They gathered cardboard boxes and slept in them – or at least, spent the night in them – in the church parking lot.

The project was similar to fundraisers for such causes as Alzheimer’s disease, cancer and many others when runners and walkers ask friends to “sponsor” their participation and the proceeds go to a nonprofit organization. The Mosaic Church members set a goal of \$2,000, which they would donate to Back Bay Mission. By sunrise, they’d collected more than \$4,000 and when they brought in the check, it was for \$5,500.

Church Pastor Dustin Boles said of the experiment: “We have two goals. One is to raise awareness so people can get a little bit of experience as to what it might be like to be homeless. Not a complete experience but enough to breed some compassion and secondly, just to raise a ton of money.”

How to do that? Outreach Pastor Jeremy Allen came up with the sponsored-box idea.

“Everybody that has spent the night in a box has sponsored their box financially, and all of the money – 100 percent of it – will go to the Back Bay Mission,” he said.

They met with reluctance at first. “Honestly,” said Jonathan Latch, “at first I was like not wanting to sleep outside, but at the last minute, I prayed about it and decided this was the best thing to do, so it was a good idea.”

Said Boles: “There was a bit of, are you kidding me kind of thing going on but once everyone realized I wasn’t kidding, everybody jumped on.”

And into their boxes for the night.

## Another Way to give

Is your congregation talking about a capital campaign in its future? Many churches find that including a component of support for wider missions within the campaign is a positive way of reflecting a church’s broader commitments to the ministry of the whole church. Could you consider a tithe to Back Bay Mission?

The **Connecticut Conference** of the UCC included Back Bay Mission as a tithe (10 percent) in its ongoing campaign, “**Now for the Future,**” designed to raise funds for their own Silver Lake camp. More than \$100,000 has already been shared with Back Bay Mission from that effort.

**Edwards Church (UCC)** in Northampton, Massachusetts, included Back Bay Mission in its capital campaign, and the result was a \$10,000 gift to our ministries in Biloxi. Amazing!

# A Voice from the Past...

The summer of 1960 found this “Connecticut Yankee” traveling from his home in New Britain, Connecticut, to Biloxi, Mississippi, for a life-enriching experience at Back Bay Mission. Having come to terms with opposition to military service as a “conscientious objector,” I entered the Program of Voluntary Service at Pottstown, Pennsylvania, a program developed by the Evangelical and Reformed Church to provide volunteer staff for health and welfare agencies affiliated with the church.

An airline flight took me to the old Mobile, Alabama, airport. I rode from Mobile to Biloxi in the Mission “Carryall,” sitting in the back seat because a loose spring in the passenger seat could cause great discomfort. As we crossed the old two-lane Ocean Springs Bridge and entered Biloxi, I met the smell of rotting oyster shells piled high near the Beachfront canneries. It would be a continuing experience as the wind carried the odor throughout town. When I arrived at the cinder block Community Center on Chartres Street, I learned that air conditioning was still to be installed.

For the next three years, I organized an early childhood education program at the Mission, and taught the kindergarten program for 5 year olds. I also conducted after-school craft groups for children from the Point area and taught Sunday School at St. Paul’s E&R Church beside the Mission property.

Sensing that teenagers in the Back Bay area had no place to socialize, BBM started a program called “Teen Town” on Friday nights at the Community Center where several hundred teenagers enjoyed dancing to a jukebox, playing table tennis and watching TV in the library. One night, as they were signing in and paying their 10 cents admission, a gal named Geraldine looked up and said to then-director, Dick Ellerbrake, “Here’s my 10 cents and I hate preachers!”

In many ways, the Mission engaged in programs to demonstrate needs to the larger community. Thus we began a family counseling agency and when it was taken over by United Way, we moved on to other pressing issues.

One member of our summer service teams was to play an important role in my future. She was Marjorie George and she was a student at Ripon College in Wisconsin. We married in 1966. Our daughter, Brynn Heather, was born in 1968, and our son, Seth Michael, in 1970. After our divorce in 1977, I raised a 7-year-old son and a 9-year-old daughter as a single parent.

In 1963, I returned to Bristol, Connecticut, where I taught school for two years to earn money for a two-year-

long program at Hartford Seminary leading to a master of arts degree in religious education.

Back at the Mission

in the summers of 1966 and 1967, I assisted with programming, meeting with members of the black community in 1966 to plan a Head Start program in Biloxi. When I came back to stay in 1967, the Head Start Program originally envisioned for Biloxi had become Harrison County-wide for more than 2,000 children. I served as its Education Director until 1969 when I returned to Back Bay Mission as Associate Director--paid by Hurricane Camille funding.

In 1974, I went to St. Thomas School in Long Beach as a fifth grade social studies teacher for grades 4-6, and art for grades 1-6. I have worked for the past 14 years for Grand Casino, Gulfport, and the Beau Rivage in Biloxi.

Since I was diagnosed with cancer, I have had two operations on my colon, and a third on my liver. I am in relatively good health, but it has lessened my ability to deal with every day issues -- especially my home.

Last summer, BBM came to my aid to paint and repair my house. Three work camp groups did their special magic on this house that was built around 1905. A group of girls from the St. Louis area were the first to arrive, followed by teams from Iowa and Florida. Bob (DiGiacomo) of the BBM staff coordinated their efforts. Cooler weather allowed a group to work on my roof, repairing and painting it to treat the sand blasting it had received from Hurricane Katrina. Bob also promised to mount two exterior motion-detecting flood lights on the sides of the house later when an experienced electrician came to town.

If one wonders about today’s young people, one must celebrate the nature of youth who have come to Mississippi to help redeem the lives of us who experienced the full force of Katrina. I am enriched by their caring efforts and presence. Back Bay Mission, which has been so much of my life, came into it in very powerful ways last summer and I shall never forget its countless gifts to my spirit. Often, the young people stopped to visit--and thank me for allowing them to paint my house!

Three front porch ceiling fans that had sat in the

living room and on the porch for four years awaiting installation were hung by Kyle Bennett from a Florida work camp group who commented at mid-week: "If all else fails, we'll read the directions!"

Each time I look at the fans in place, my spirits soar. This is more than just getting a job done; it is an example of community ministry to those in need--like me--who hold a special fondness in their hearts for a place called Back Bay Mission.

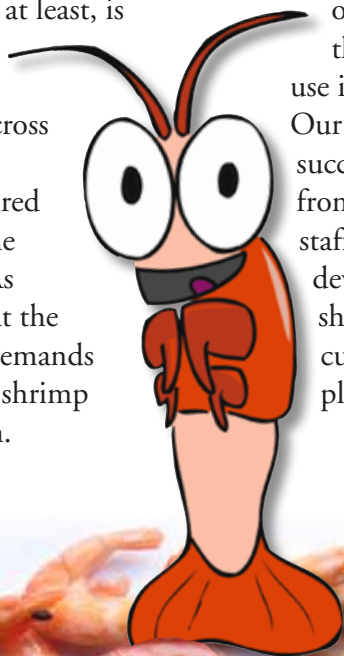

## What about those Shrimp Boils?

Many have asked the question, "Are you going to start doing those shrimp boils again?" The answer, for the moment at least, is "probably not." While the shrimp boils were a wonderful way to connect with supporters old and new across the United Church of Christ from the early '70s up until 2005, they also required an enormous amount of energy and time on the part of Back Bay Mission staff. As programs and ministry have expanded at the Mission in the last several years, other demands have taken necessary priority and made shrimp boils a very difficult activity to maintain.

But that doesn't mean *you* can't do shrimp boils without us! Many congregations, Associations and Conferences of the United Church of Christ have taken it upon themselves to organize their own shrimp boil and use it as a fund-raising event for Back Bay Mission. Our 'secret' recipes and helpful suggestions for doing a successful shrimp boil are on our website and available from the Mission office. Give it a try! In some cases, staff, Board members, former volunteers or the Mission's development associates may even be able to attend your shrimp boil and offer a meaningful presentation on current ministries of BBM. Let us know what you're planning and how we can help.



## Empty Bowls

In 2009, the pottery and ceramics instructor at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College's Jeff Davis Campus contacted Back Bay Mission about having his students do a fund raiser for Back Bay Mission as the "service-learning" project that is part of their course each semester. Because it seemed the perfect fit with their practical experience – molding and throwing pottery – they chose Empty Bowls, the North Carolina-based but internationally known grass roots movement to end hunger.

Their idea was interesting. The first-year students would make bread plates using plywood molds while the more advanced, studio students would throw bowls on a pottery wheel. They then decorated the pieces, glazed and fired them – and the first year, sold them, making \$885 for Back Bay Mission.

During Spring Semester 2010, the students did the same thing, but Back Bay Mission added a simple supper of soup and salad to go with the bowls. At \$15 a ticket, the holder got a bowl and a plate – and the meal. The students supplied 200 pieces –100 each of bowls and plates – of all colors and interesting glazes. Back Bay Mission offered 100 tickets for sale and sold them all. While many buyers chose take-out to eating-in, from all reports they declared the idea "awesome," and want it done again next year. ## *Food, Glorious Food!* by Maria Watson

*Old Mother Hubbard  
went to the cupboard  
to give the poor dog a bone.  
But when she got there,  
the cupboard was bare,  
and so the poor dog had none.*

Those lyrics to the 19<sup>th</sup> century English nursery rhyme don't exactly apply to Back Bay Mission's Food Pantry. There is, of course, no "old Mother Hubbard," no "poor dog" and no "bone." But the experience is similar to what Emergency Caseworker Jill Cartledge felt when she surveyed the Food Pantry and found the shelves almost empty.

What to do? she wondered.

So many people were coming to the Mission requesting food that little was left and Cartledge was anxious about how she would meet the need. More and more people seemed to be coming, she says, "even people who had once donated to us." The economy had worsened and unemployment had risen.

At a luncheon honoring another Mission employee, Cartledge spotted a local TV reporter who had done a story on Back Bay Mission's distribution of Christmas food boxes. Cartledge told the reporter of her dilemma, the reporter went back to the station and told the news director about it and the evening anchorman was dispatched to do the story.

What his interview with Cartledge and volunteer Jennifer Rowles produced was more than overwhelming. "Someone will help us," an upbeat Rowles had said as the story ended. "Someone always does."

But they were totally unprepared for happened next. The heavens seemed to open and food rained down. The telephone rang incessantly as people called to inquire about how they could help. Vehicle after vehicle pulled up to the pantry door and disgorged itself of fresh meat, canned goods, packaged non-perishables – a superabundance of almost everything edible imaginable. The refrigerator filled up; the freezer filled up; the shelves were stocked – and still the food poured in. Rowles' prediction had certainly been right on the mark.

One local family pulled up on a Saturday morning with a trailer-load of food. They declined to be

acknowledged publicly, although they did permit photos. A young couple, Josh and Gwen Wickman from north Georgia came several days later and unloaded a packed SUV. "I wish we had done more," lamented Gwen as she looked around the now-cramped pantry. They had learned of the impromptu food drive on a friend's Facebook page!

The reporter came back to do a second story – on the response to the first.

"Every time you think you've seen the best a community can do," says Cartledge, "they raise the bar a million-fold.

"I am just stupefied at the response to this appeal. This is such a giving community."

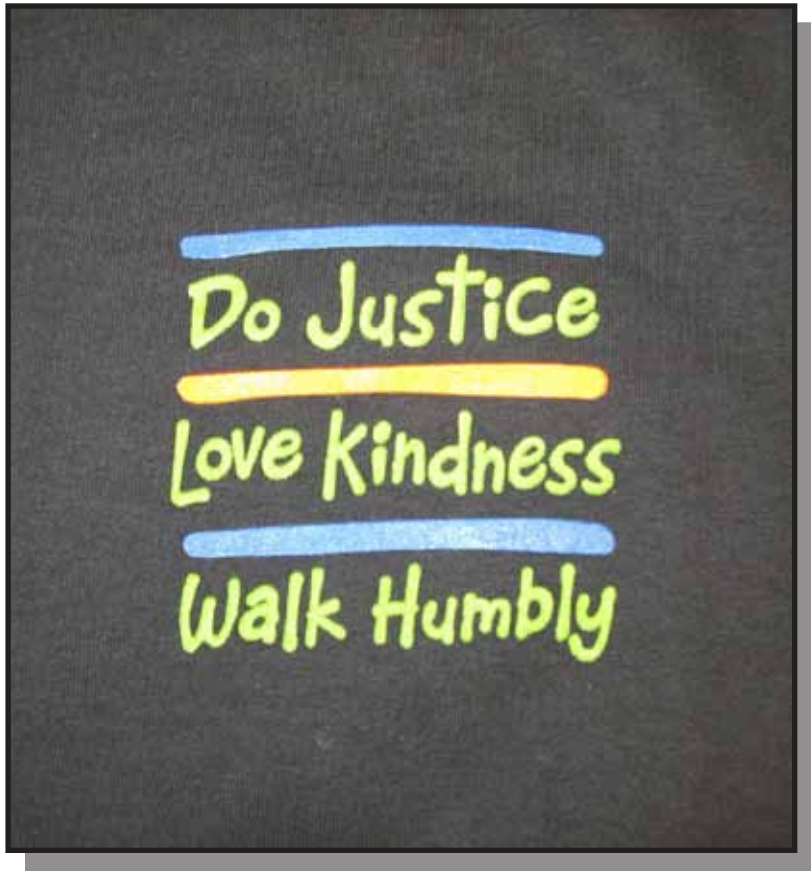
